Dear Parishioners, Devotees and Pilgrims of Our Lady of Velankanni,

The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary and for the World Missions. The Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated on October 7. The word Rosary means "Crown of Roses". Our Lady has revealed to several people that each time they say a Hail Mary they are giving her a beautiful rose and that each complete Rosary makes her a crown of roses. The rose is the queen of flowers, and so the Rosary is the rose of all devotions and it is therefore the most important one. The Holy Rosary is considered a perfect prayer because within it lies the awesome story of our salvation. With your prayer made together with our heavenly Mother, we can obtain the great gift of bringing about a change of hearts and conversion. Each day, through prayer we can drive away from ourselves and from our homeland many dangers and many evils.

Focus of the Liturgy: All the Gospels for the Sundays in October 2020 are taken from St. Matthew and are from Year A, Cycle 2.

October 4th - 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time	This Gospel recounts the parable of the landowner and the vineyard.
October 11th - 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time	This Gospel recounts the parable of the wedding banquet.
October 18th - 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time World Mission Sunday	Jesus says to "Render to Caesar what is Caesar's".
October 25th - 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time	In this Gospel Jesus gives us the greatest commandment.

During the month of October we in a special way celebrate World Mission Sunday. Pope Francis released his annual message for World Mission Sunday 2020 on Pentecost Sunday. Its theme is taken from Isaiah: "Here am I, send me" (6:8). World Mission Sunday is celebrated on October 18 in 2020.

Missionaries with Jesus the Missionary: Just as Jesus completely accomplished His mission by dying on the cross, "we find ourselves precisely when we give ourselves to others", Pope Francis continues. Our mission, our call, our willingness to be sent originates in His own vocation as "the Father's Missionary". "Our personal vocation" is rooted in "the fact that we are sons and daughters of God in the Church".

The Church as Missionary: Pope Francis explains that it is specifically the Church that "continues the mission of Jesus in history". Thus the baptized members of the Church are sent forth in her name. Through our witness and proclamation of the Gospel, God continues "to manifest His love". This is how He is able to "touch and transform hearts, minds, bodies, societies and cultures in every place and time."

FROM SURVIVAL TO REVIVAL

On September 15, 2020, 16 of our SCC Coordinators, Animators, PPC members and lay heads participated in the online training conducted by Dean Jaime and Lygia from OFLCM. The topic for the training was 'From Survival to Revival' the Holy Father's message of hope on 'Life after the pandemic'.

The training began with a brief discussion on the thorns and roses that each of us experienced due to the Pandemic. Jaime and Lygia spoke about the early months of 2020, when Pope Francis frequently reflected on the coronavirus pandemic as it took hold of the human family. They spoke about the eight significant spoken and written texts dated from 27 March to 22 April. The Pope clearly bases this hope on faith, because with God life never dies. The Pope challenges everyone – no matter how high or humble – to dare to do good, to do better. We then dwelt on each of the 8 messages from the Holy Father, a gist of which is mentioned below:

1. Why are you afraid: But you, Lord, will not leave us at the mercy of the storm. Tell us again: Do not be afraid (Mt 28:5). And we, together with Peter, "cast all our anxieties onto you, for you care about us" (cf. 1 Pet 5:7).

2. Preparing for afterwards is important: The Holy Father is edified by the reaction of so many people including doctors, nurses, volunteers, religious and priests, who are risking their lives to attend to the sick and prevent those who are healthy from becoming infected including the amazing work done by governments.

3. Like a new Flame: Indifference, self-centeredness, division and forgetfulness are not words we want to hear at this time. May Christ, who has already defeated death and opened for us the way to eternal salvation, dispel the darkness of our suffering humanity and lead us into the light of his glorious day, a day that knows no end.

4. To an invisible army: Stand firm in your struggle and care for each other as brothers and sisters. I pray for you, I pray with you. I want to ask God our Father to bless you, to fill you with his love, and to defend you on this path, giving you the strength that keeps us standing tall and that never disappoints: hope. Please pray for me, because I need it too.

5. A plan to rise up again: In this time of tribulation and mourning, I hope that, where you are, you will be able to experience Jesus, who comes to meet you, greets you and says: "Rejoice"

6.Egoism: An even worse Virus: Like the apostle Thomas, let us accept mercy, the salvation of the world. And let us show mercy to those who are most vulnerable; for only in this way will we build a new world.

7. To the world of Street Newspapers: The pandemic has made your work difficult but I am sure that the great network of street papers will come back stronger than ever. These days, turning our gaze to the poorest can help all of us to realise how much is actually happening to us, and what our circumstances really are.

8. Overcome global challenges: As brothers and sisters, let us together implore our heavenly Father: "Send forth your Spirit, O Lord, and renew the face of the earth"

We ended this reflection with a hymn looking up to the Lord, putting all our hope in him.
