### FROM THE DESK OF PARISH PRIEST

Dear Parishioners, Devotees and Pilgrims of Our Lady of Velankanni,

There is a wave of excitement and expectation as December draws closer and as we enter into the season of Christmas to celebrate the Incarnation of God's only Son. Waiting and preparation are the two key words for the first 24 days of December. Christmas brings much-needed joy amid the Corona virus pandemic. It is a commemoration and celebration of God's self-giving love in His only son Jesus Christ. In these unprecedented times our lives should be lived in the works of love, charity, forgiveness and above all in docile to the Spirit of God.

The Immaculate Conception is a solemnity celebrated on December 8th. We recall with joy Mary's preservation from all stain of original sin from the first moment of her existence, by the foreseen merits of Christ. God touched her life in an extraordinary way, because He chose her to be the mother of His Son. For this, she was born Immaculate. Not because of any merit on her part, but because of God's grace. The first 24 days of December fall during the liturgical season of Advent and are represented by the liturgical color purple — a symbol of penance, mortification and the sorrow of a contrite heart. The remaining days of December marks the beginning of the Christmas season. The liturgical color changes to white or gold — a symbol of joy, purity and innocence.

The story of Christmas is about love — love in the midst of bleakness, cruelty, or just plain consumerism and busy-ness. Our God cannot be held in Heaven, but comes to us to break in to the hardness or the loneliness of our hearts. The birth of Christ brings us a message of hope to this pandemic soaked world, that God still loves the world. Every human being is very precious in the sight of God. He does not want anyone to be lost. Therefore, the feast of Christmas invites the suffering humanity to live our lives in way of God's Precepts thus giving meaning and hope to each other. The Gospels for the Sundays in December are taken from St. Mark, St. Luke and St. John. the following readings are from Year B and Cycle 1:

December 6th - 2nd Sunday in Advent	The Gospel is about John the Baptist preaching in the wilderness.
December 13th - 3rd Sunday in Advent	The crowds question St. John the Baptist asking him who he is?
December 20th - 4th Sunday in Advent	This Gospel recounts the story of the Angel Gabriel's appearance to Zechariah in the temple.
December 27th - Holy Family	This Gospel recounts the prophecy of Simeon.



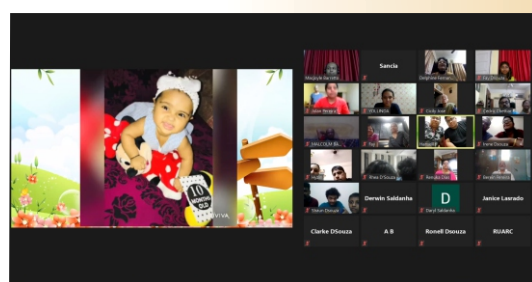
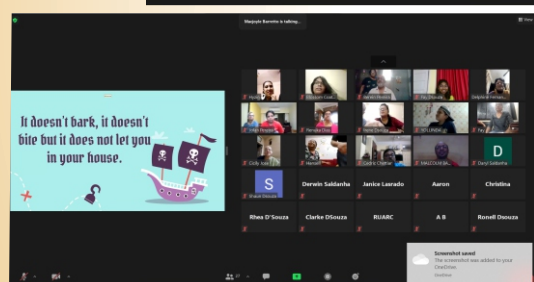
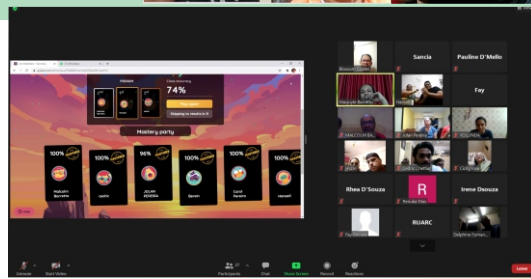
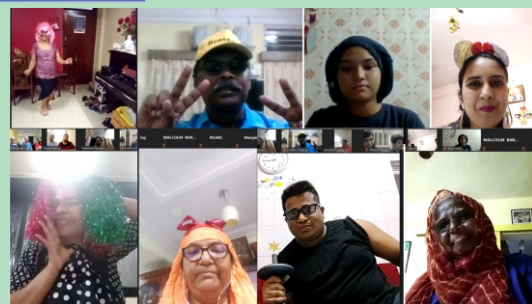
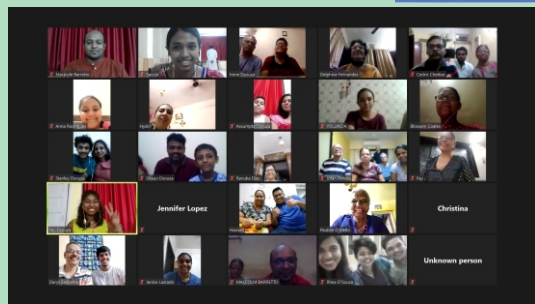
These two days, for us Anthonians, became the perfect time to think about our own life and reminded us that to continue to put our Faith in the Lord Jesus, the Soon and coming King.

To make the Eucharistic celebration meaningful and safe for you and others, please adhere to the below mentioned guidelines :



Please arrive at least 10 minutes before the celebration starts. At the entrance, there will be a thermal scan. Please use the hand 'sanitizer' before entering the church. No Holy Water fountains will be available. Please enter the church in silence and reverence.



It is mandatory to wear your mask continuously, even during the Eucharistic celebration. Only 2 people will be allowed to sit in a pew.



Holy Communion will be distributed at the end of the mass, outside the church. Please receive the communion in your hand and in a prayerful manner exit the church.



Please do not touch the statues while venerating. No offering in the form of flowers and candles will be allowed.



Elderly above 60 years and children below 10 years are requested not to attend mass in church. This is for their safety.
