The month of January is dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus, which is celebrated on 3rd January. The first ten days of January falls under the liturgical season known as Christmas which is represented by the liturgical color white — the color of light, a symbol of joy, purity and innocence (absolute or restored). The remaining days of January are the beginning of Ordinary Time, which is represented by the liturgical color green. This symbol of hope is the color of the sprouting seed and arouses in the faithful the hope of reaping the eternal harvest of heaven, especially the hope of a glorious resurrection. It is used in the Offices and Masses of Ordinary Time.

Focus of the Liturgy, the Gospel readings for the Sundays in January are taken from St. Matthew, St. Mark and St. John: from Year B, Cycle 1.

January 3rd - Epiphany of the Lord	This Gospel is about the Wise Kings visit to the Christ Child.
January 10th - Baptism of the Lord	This Gospel is about Jesus' baptism by John in the Jordan.
January 17th - 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time	In this Gospel, Jesus says to Peter, "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas"
January 24th - 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time	In this Gospel, Jesus calls Peter and Andrew to be fishers of men
January 31st - 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time	Jesus frees the man with the unclean spirit.

In the first part of January, we continue to rejoice and celebrate Christ's coming at Bethlehem and in our hearts.

We have the wonderful feast of Mary, Mother of God, where we honour Mary's highest title, and then we journey with the Magi to the crib as they bring their gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh to adore the savior of the world on the feast of Epiphany. We reach the culmination of this season by drawing the curtain with the feast Baptism of Our Lord by St. John the Baptist. Finally, we have to remove our decorations and enter into the liturgical period known as Ordinary Time where we devote ourselves to the mystery of Christ in its entirety.

To make this Eucharistic celebration meaningful and safe for you and others please adhere to the below mentioned guidelines:

- Please arrive at least 10 minutes before the celebration starts. At the entrance there will be a thermal scan. Please use the hand sanitizer before entering the church. No Holy Water founts will be available, please enter the church in silence and reverence.
- It is mandatory to wear your mask continuously, even during the Eucharistic celebration. Only 2 people will be allowed to sit in a pew.
- Holy Communion will be distributed at the end of the mass, outside the church. Please receive the communion in your hand and in a prayerful manner exit the church. Please follow instructions of the ushers.
- Please do not touch the statues while venerating. No offering in the form of flowers and candles will be allowed.
- A box marked 'Church Offerings' has been placed at the entrance of the church. Please put in your offering as you leave church after mass. There will be no box collection during offertory.
- Elderly above 60 years and children below 10 years are requested not to attend mass in church. This is for their safety.














GOLDEN JUBILEE CELEBRATION OF RELIGIOUS PROFESSIONS
