FROM THE DESK OF PARISH PRIEST

Dear Parishioners, Devotees and Pilgrims of Our Lady of Velankanni,

During the month of March, we begin the Season of LENT. Lent is meant to be a time of repentance. These 40 days are set aside to praise and worship the Lord; to read the Bible more, and to pray more often, give charity and live in fasting. Christians who observe Lent anticipate deeper intimacy with the Lord.

We will continue our journey to the cross with our acts of penitence. We willreflect on our mortality (Remember man thou art dust) and the shortness of life (and to dust thou shall return). We will heed the call, now is the acceptable time, and now is "the day of salvation" (2 Corinthians 6:2).

Focus of the Liturgy: The Gospel readings for the Sundays in March follow the Lenten season from Cycle C, unless a parish has catechumens, so they would then follow Cycle A. The Weekday readings follow the annual Lenten readings.

March 6 th 1 st Sunday of Lent	Year C, Luke 4:1-13: Jesus is led into the desert and tempted by Satan.
March 13 th 2 nd Sunday of Lent	Year A, Matthew 17:1-9: The Gospel relates the story of the Transfiguration of our Lord on Mt. Tabor.
March 20 th 3 rd Sunday of Lent	Year C, Luke 13:1-9: Jesus tells the parable of the barren fig tree.
March 27 th 4 th Sunday of Lent	Year C, Luke 15:1-3, 11-32: The Gospel recounts the parable of the Prodigal Son.

The Solemnity of St. Joseph (March 19) is a special landmark this month in which we will celebrate the great honour bestowed upon the foster father of Jesus. St. John Paul II said, "Because St. Joseph is the protector of the Church, he is the guardian of the Eucharist and the Christian family. Therefore, we must turn to St. Joseph today to ward off attacks upon the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist and upon the family. We must plead with St. Joseph to guard the Eucharistic Lord and the Christian family during this time of peril."

The Solemnity of the Annunciation (March 25) enables us to ponder on Our Lady's fiat. The Solemnity of the Annunciation celebrates the coming of the Angel Gabriel to the Virgin Mary to announce to her the special mission God had chosen for her in being the mother of His only son. We are continually reminded of the importance of this feast to our salvation in various devotional prayers. Two examples that highlight the importance of this feast are the joyous mysteries of the Rosary and the Angelus. This feast celebrates the Incarnation of the Second Person of the Trinity and the salvation of all mankind.

O Holy Virgin Mary, we ask your intercession to make us as generous as you in accepting the will of God in our lives, especially when that will is expressed in mysterious ways. May you be our example of a generous response to what God desires of us.

Have blessed Season of LENT


