### FROM THE DESK OF PARISH PRIEST

Dear Parishioners, Devotees and Pilgrims of Our Lady of Velankanni,

The month of May is dedicated to The Blessed Virgin Mary. In his 1965 encyclical, Mense Maio, Pope Paul VI wrote about the importance of Mary's intercession for all the world, explaining that those who encounter her, encounter her Son, Jesus the Catholic Church has dedicated May in her honour.

Focus of the Liturgy: The Gospel readings for May are taken from St. John, except for the feast of the Ascension, which is taken from St. Luke. All are from Year C, Weekdays Cycle 2.

May 1st 3rd Sunday of Easter	Jesus revealed himself to his disciples at the Sea of Tiberias.
May 8 <sup>th</sup> 4 <sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter	The Gospel is about Jesus as the Good Shepherd.
May 15 <sup>th</sup> 5 <sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter	Christ gives the commandment to love as He loves.
May 22 <sup>nd</sup> 6 <sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter	In this Gospel, Jesus promises to send the Holy Spirit.
May 29 <sup>th</sup> Ascension or 7 <sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter	As Jesus blessed them he parted from them and was taken up to heaven.

It is Mary's month in the Easter season and all of nature rejoices with the Queen of heaven at the Resurrection of the Son she was worthy to bear. During the remainder of Easter time, let us endeavor through the prayers of the Holy Liturgy and the Holy Rosary to deepen our gratitude for the mystery of our Baptismal rebirth in Christ.

"The month of May, with its profusion of blooms was adopted by the Church in the eighteenth century as a celebration of the flowering of Mary's maidenly spirituality...With its origins in Isaiah's prophecy of the Virgin birth of the Messiah under the figure of the Blossoming Rod or Root of Jesse, the flower symbolism of Mary was extended by the Church Fathers, and in the liturgy, by applying to her the flower figures of the Wisdom Books-Canticles, Wisdom, Proverbs and Sirach.

"In the hierarchy of holiness it is precisely the 'woman', Mary of Nazareth, who is the 'figure' of the Church. She 'precedes' everyone on the path to holiness; in her person 'the Church has already reached that perfection whereby she exists without spot or wrinkle". — (St. John Paul II Mulieris Dignitatem, 1988.)

Dear friends, after 55 years of service to the Church of Our Lady of Velankanni, Irla, we, the PIME fathers are saying good-bye to Irla. Upon the advice of our Superior General and in dialogue with Cardinal and keeping in mind the Charism of PIME, we are moving away from Irla parish so that we may concentrate more in the mission of the Church.

### **DIVINE MERCY FEAST**



# 55 years of faithful service of PIME to the Church of Our Lady of Velankanni, Irla

After more than five decades of service, the Pontifical Institute for Foreign Missions (PIME) moves from the Church of Our Lady of Health of Velankanni, Irla, and henceforth, an Archdiocesan Priest will shepherd the parish.

The Parish at Irla, has been under the stewardship of PIME, which was founded by Servant of God Bishop Angelo Ramazzotti on 30th July, 1850 in Italy. The Charism of the Congregation of PIME is:

- Ad Gentes Non-Christians. PIME members work among the Non-Christians.
- Ad Extra Outside. PIME members are sent outside their local churches, cultures and native land.
- Ad Vitam For all life. PIME members work in the missions for all life.
- **Together** Community life. PIME member live as a family of Apostles

In 1966, the PIME Society came to Mumbai looking for an in-transit base for their missionaries travelling across the globe. Irla, a small suburb in Western Mumbai, located close to the airport, was the ideal choice.


Rev. Fr. Bruno Venturin, the first shepherd, was the architect of this devotion to our Blessed Mother. We cannot forget the huge contribution made by the co-founders, and the nine parish priests, who have shepherded the Irla parishioners, with assistance from priests of different congregations and the myriad devotees. Religious congregations like Missionary Sisters of the Immaculate - MSI (Nirmala Sisters), Carmelite Sisters of Charity, Vedruna and Sisters of St. Ann of Luzern, played an important role in assisting the Parish Priest. As the devotion to Our Lady of Velankanni saw a quantum leap, over the years, devotees from all over the metropolis and beyond, flocked to this shrine. The annual novenas were first initiated in 1968 with the hoisting of a flag on Rev. Fr. P. Rajarussel Tributus, PIME August 30th. The 'Blessing of the Sick' and the 'Procession of Our Lady have been the highlights of the annual novena celebrations.

PIME Priests' missionary zeal, deep devotion to Our Lady, simple lifestyle, unassuming affability and love for the needy have left an indelible mark.

PIME Institute is commended for their commitment to dedicating themselves as lifelong messengers of the Gospel in the remote areas of the world.


